After college he worked at IBM's Watson Research Center working on a number of projects including semiconductor testing, speech recognition, and computer system development. He later returned to Austin to continue working at IBM. Joe was passionate about music and continued to perform after moving back to Texas.

After retiring, he was very involved in caring for his parents, enabling them to stay in their home as they grew older. Throughout his life he maintained strong Jewish values, kept kosher and honored the Shabbat and Holidays. He was an avid explorer of Jewish philosophy.

Joe was smart, witty, insightful, multi-talented and caring. He was greatly loved by family and friends and especially his nieces and nephews with whom he spent many an hour singing, playing games and teaching them many things from math to juggling.
