It is with profound sadness that we mourn the passing yesterday of our CAA Family Member Dr. Ronny Ginor (z"l); beloved husband for 23 years of Diana; cherished father of Sivan, Amanda (Ami), and Mira; loving brother of Natti and Natalie Ginor and Eyal And Laurie Ginor; surrogate brother (achi) to dozens around the globe. Ronny (z"l) is predeceased by his father Amos (z"l), his mother Zvia (a"n) and his godfather, former Israeli Prime Minister, Shimonr Peres (z"l).

Ronny (z"l) was born in Savion, Israel and grew up in Great Neck, NY. He met his beloved Diana while on Semester at Sea in 1991. Dr. Ginor (z"l) served as CEO of Mirabel Medical Systems, and also Becker and Associates Consulting. He served in the Israel Defense Forces (IDF), in Unit 8200. After training at George Washington University, Dr. Ginor (z"l) trained at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center and published on three dimensional radiation therapy of the prostate. He earned patented technologies related to breast cancer, thyroid disease, and cardiology. For the past seven years, Dr. Ginor (z"l) was a Venture Partner with Orbimed Healthcare Fund Management and a Board Director of FusMobile and Steadymed. In addition, Ronny (z"l) was a benefactor to the Austin Jewish Academy, helping to seed the Becker Science Center. He was a founder of Austin based Craft Scooter and was a leader in much of the East 51st Street community revitalization. With Diana, he traveled the world, enjoying laughter and daily morning coffee. He had an unparalleled network of friends around the world. He was also a seasoned cowboy owning a myriad of top bred paso fino horses as well as prize worthy stallions and longhorns. Rooted with pride as an Israel, Ronny (z"l) reserved his highest pride and joy in the time he shared nurturing his relationships with each of his uniquely talented, wise, mature, and beautiful daughters. He was 52.

Ron was one of the most interesting, intense, captivating, and inspirational people I have known and was the closest thing to a hero who has also been a friend.

He inspired me to become an entrepreneur while I was working for him as a 23-year-old copyeditor at Mirabel Medical, by telling me a story about time and the difference it makes with how you use it. He followed up with me and mentored me along the way as I bootstrapped a business, encouraged me to keep going, and reassured me in the hard times with a confident promise that we could always figure something else out if things really didn't work. Having such a capable and connected person getting my back was a giant blessing, and something that felt like I could never pay back. It imparted such a sense of safety and excitement. For him, I imagine it was simply a gift, or an adventure to share.

Feeling safety and excitement at the same time is a rare and wonderful feeling. It is what it felt like to spend time with Ron. It's the feeling of going on an adventure with a veteran guide who knows he is about to have a lot of fun despite any challenge, and who relates as a peer rather than a superior.

He had a seemingly endless list of mysterious friends and contacts, and to brush elbows with them felt like being connected to something important, magical, and glamorous.

Ron was a master storyteller, a master at stirring and sharing his passion, joy, anger, playfulness, and intensity. Being around him could be hilarious, intense, lighthearted, scary, silly, defeating, or inspiring. His eyes were incredibly capable of expressing all of those things. He was full spectrum and intense.

To lose him so soon leaves a big hole in my life and heart. I feel like I'm losing a portal to a world of possibility and excitement whose scale was vastly larger than anything I could ever deserve or create myself. Ron was truly a great man.

“ I met Ronny just 5 years ago - in a Tel Aviv hotel lobby, arranged by Natti - but feel like I've known him for many lifetimes.

Few relationships have had such profound impact on my life.

Life has provided me with the good fortune of many great friendships but Ronny was unique in that he embodied more positive attributes than anyone I've ever known - compassion, kindness, intellect, insight, wit, success, strength, risk taking, authentic, loyal, adventurous, spontaneous, great sense of humor, and most of all commitment to family.

He was always warm and welcoming. He saw things others didn't. He was full of ideas that were sometimes complex, but often brilliant in their simplicity. He had a magnetic personality and he never took life or himself too seriously. He projected an incredible energy that made those around him feel intensely alive in the present. His personality provided a reflection of - what always felt like - one's best possible self.

This passage from the Great Gatsby reminds me of Ronny

"It was one of those rare smiles with a quality of eternal reassurance in it, that you may come across four or five times in life. It understood you just so far as you wanted to be understood, believed in you as you would like to believe in yourself and assured you that it had precisely the impression of you that, at your best, you hoped to convey."

“ Ronny had been my best friend and adopted brother since we served in the IDF together more than 30 years ago.
We spent most of our lives in different continents and yet we were always there for each other in our most important moments.
I was there when he proposed to Diana. He was not only there when I proposed to Yael, my beloved late wife – the surprise engagement party was on his 30th birthday, exactly 22 years ago.
When Yael passed away Ronny appeared at my doorstep and stayed for more than 2 weeks. One day he went to the Negev and brought us back a Ronny gift – a cute flea infested puppy he saved from the sewer in a Bedouin village and washed in sea water before bringing it home to the grieving family, and though it was the last thing I thought I wanted to see that night, it was exactly what we needed.
A World without Ronny is incomplete.
This is stating the obvious to all of us here-but this would be obvious in every funeral, as everyone misses their loved ones.
In Ronny's case, it's true for so many more
It is true for the Tel Aviv taxi driver who couldn't afford to replace his tires when he picked up Ronny. By the end of his ride, he could.
It is true for the Jamaican tourist van owner who told Ronny how hard he struggled to win customers battling other drivers for every tourist walking out the terminal doors. A month later, he had his own professional web site with enthusiastic reviews on trip advisor.
It is true for the Druze teenager who participated in a course for Palestinian, Jordanian and Israeli youth dreaming to become Doctors. Ronny taught in this course and the teenager earned a friend and mentor for life.
It is true for the women undergoing chemotherapy who don't even know Ronny paid for their wigs
It would have been true for countless others who now will never have the chance to be touched by the Ronny magic.
What is the Ronny magic? It's the enchanted combination of the ability to connect with any person, be they a homeless person, a University professor or a billionaire. The ability to listen and make them feel that in this point in time they are the most important person in the world for Ronny and then the ability to provide help, compassion, or good advice as the case may require.
You could sum this up as true love of people.
Mix in the love of life – always maximizing good experiences – and you get the type of magic that we were all privileged to have lighting our lives.
Ronny is gone, and the world is incomplete without him. It is a void we cannot fill – but maybe we can keep some of his magic alive.
By creating our own "Ronny moments", adding this touch to our experiences, connecting with people we wouldn't normally, and trying to do a little unexpected good, we can keep
the Ronny magic alive not only in our hearts but also in this world.
