Anthony David Hein passed away from heart surgery complications on January 10th in Austin, Texas. David, as he was best known while growing up in Houston, graduated from San Jacinto High School and was a member of Congregation Beth Jacob. From the moment he held his first toy airplane he was mesmerized by aircraft of all kinds. Earlier in his career, he served in the Air Force and would later go on to work for United Airlines for 20 years as an aircraft mechanic. For the years in between the two, guided by that ever-adventurous spirit and gregarious nature, he became an accomplished, well-known bull-fighter. In other fearless fashion, he also became a Private Investigator and enjoyed the thrill of bringing down members of the mob and other criminals that other PI's were far less eager to go after. Later known as Tony to his United Airlines and Sun City Georgetown friends, he was always up for adventure whether it was sailing his boat, going on scenic motorcycling trips, hunting or participating in riflery events. People would say he was always going on age 16. Even this past year at 80 he remained steadfast and determined to build an airplane from scratch and fly it. Most importantly, he was a devoted uncle to his two nieces Tiffany Hein Golden and Paige Hein Cattano, remained very close to his older brother Don H.
