Barry Levine, 80, passed away peacefully on April 15.

Born and raised in Brooklyn, Barry lived a full and vibrant life that took him from Washington, D.C., to Akron, Ohio; Houston, Texas; Buffalo, New York; and ultimately Austin, where he built community everywhere he went.

Barry was preceded in death by his parents, his sister Judy, his twin sister Barbara, and his beloved wife of 49 years, Hermine, the love of his life. Together, Barry and Hermine created not just a family, but a sense of home wherever they landed.

He is survived by his children, Aaron (Liza) Levine and Felicia (Tim) Ferrel; his cherished Jaden, who gave him his favorite title, "Poppy"; his sister Meryl (Fred) Roth; and many nieces, nephews, and dear friends who were fortunate enough to be considered part of his extended family.

Barry spent much of his career in retail management, including traveling the world as a shoe buyer, a role that perfectly suited his curiosity and love of people. He even had the unforgettable experience of participating as a clown in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, a reflection of his playful spirit and sense of humor.

If you were with Barry, you were family-no exceptions. He had a gift for connection, whether through his quick wit, endless trivia, classic dad jokes, or the wisdom he shared so generously. He was strong, deeply kind, and a fierce protector of those he loved.

Above all, being "Poppy" was his greatest joy. His humor, warmth, and life lessons will live on in everyone lucky enough to have known him.

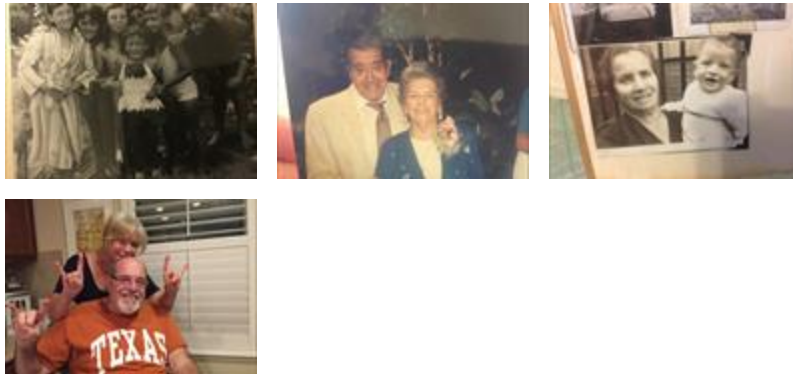
