It is with sadness that we mourn the passing of Ed Fudman; cherished husband for 39 years of Cindy; adored father of David and Rehana Fudman, and Rachel Fudman Torkiver and Arthur Torkiver; beloved grandfather of Mira and Avi; brother of Susan and Jeff Koch.

Ed grew up in Baltimore as a third-generation resident of the city. He attended Duke University for undergraduate and medical school, completing his internship and residency there as well, before finishing his fellowship in rheumatology at the University of Michigan. After joining the faculty at Baylor College of Medicine, Ed and his family moved to Austin where he joined a clinic before he established himself as a solo practitioner. Ed was known for having a warm bedside manner, deeply listening to his patients with strength and compassion.

Ed's family was his utmost priority. He was an endless wealth of information and showed his love for his family by diving deep into their topics of interest. When he was passionate about a hobby, such as pickleball, lottery ticket collecting, or credit card points, he went all in. He was an early adopter of new technology, and had one of the first Teslas on the market. Ed loved to travel and enjoyed reading, particularly non-fiction and about U.S. presidents. He cared deeply about people's health and sustainability. Nothing made him laugh more than his grandchildren. He will be dearly missed. He was 67.
