Elenn Rose Steinberg, 71, of Denver, Colorado passed away on April 11, 2024. She was a beloved wife, mother, sister, and friend. Elenn was a graduate of the University of Colorado. Her passion for teaching children to read drove her to be the dedicated Co-Founder and Executive Director of Orton Gillingham International, where her company provides training to teachers on how to teach children to read. Additionally, she was the Founder and educational director of Every Child Reading, a non-profit organization that offered literacy-building summer camps and year round tutoring for students in need.
