Evy's love for music started at a very young age when she learned to play the accordion and the violin, followed by the guitar and piano. She regularly entertained residents at the local nursing home. Evy later used her talents to teach and inspire children at summer camp as well as Hebrew school.

She met the love of her life, Ed, at Surprise Lake Summer Camp in Cold Spring, New York where Ed was a lifeguard and Evy was a camp counselor. They were married in 1966 in Brooklyn, New York. Soon after starting their family, they moved to Texas where they raised their four girls.

In addition to her musical talent, Evy showed creativity through art and writing. She was her husband's biggest supporter and helper throughout his career. Evy had a strong entrepreneurial spirit. She started a small sewing business and later a grant writing business.

However, the job she loved the most was that of mother to her four daughters.

She poured her talents and love into their lives, and created a home full of love, music and laughter.

Her life touched the lives of countless others, and her wit and humor left people laughing wherever she went.

As her family grew, Evy added the roles of mother-in-law, Gramma, and Chava (great grandma). Evy's legacy will live on in her four daughters, their families, their children, and their children's children.
