Joanna Easterly Hoffman, 72, of Austin, Texas passed away on June 4 after a brief but fierce battle with brain cancer.

Joanna was born in Gilmer, Texas to Joe and Ruth Easterly (née Pope). She is survived by her husband of 51 years, Tom, and her sons, Andrew and Mark. She worked as a medical technologist in Hematology at Seton Medical Center for nearly 20 years and was a longtime member of Covenant Presbyterian Church, where she was a faithful attendee of the Sarah-Elizabeth Bible Study Circle, volunteered with the VISIONS program, and served several terms as Treasurer for the Presbyterian Women's Coordinating Team.

Joanna passed away at home, in the house shaded by trees she planted. She was an avid gardener and animal lover who rescued cats and took joy in watching the birds that visited her backyard feeder and bath. Her care and devotion to her garden withstood even the greatest forces of nature-only Joanna's good nature could convince city construction crews to quietly join her side and outsmart bureaucracy to save neighborhood trees.

Joanna was a wonderful cook and always generous in feeding friends and family-those who have had her chocolate sheet cake will attest. Her recipes, complete with her own handwritten tips and tweaks, live on in the kitchens of friends, family, and her sons. She loved teaching others in the kitchen,

especially young cooks just starting out.

Joanna faced life's challenges with grace, humor, and a fierce commitment to the people she loved. She was more likely to ask about your troubles than to dwell on her own. Her spirit lives on in the lives she touched and the beauty she created. To know her was to be cared for.
