Joseph C. Sultanik, 90, passed away peacefully on Jan 20, 2022, in Austin, Texas. He was born November 23rd, 1931, in Buffalo, NY to Morris and Sadie Sultanik. He is survived by his wife Bonnie of 51 years, his four sons, and his sister.

compassion in his later years are to be admired and learned from. He was content with his life and his many successes. His final message was don't let life worry you, enjoy it, remain calm and when problems arise remember these words "this too shall pass".

He is survived by his wife Bonnie, son Michael and wife Dinah with their two children and five grandchildren, son Paul and wife Gail, son Bryan and wife Mia with their three children and two children from his previous wife Annabelle, son Sam and wife Cindy and their two children, and his sister Mildred. 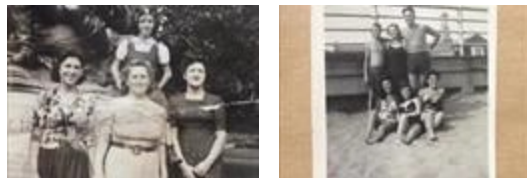
