Linda Barbara Kalter, 76, most recently of Round Rock, Texas, formerly of Central Florida, passed away on Friday, May 19, 2023 from medical complications. She was born on February 16, 1947 in the Bronx, New York to Anna and William Fishkin. She left New York in 1975 and headed south to warmer weather. She spent 43 years in Central Florida raising her three children Jeremy, Bill, and Sharon. For many of those years she taught high school and middle school, played tennis, wrote poetry (and the occasional letter to the editor), and was very involved with her congregation, especially the choir. In 1998 she met her soulmate Steven, with whom she spent the next 25 years sharing adventures and spending time with their children and grandchildren. Recently, she and Steven moved to the Austin, Texas area to be close to one of her sons. Linda is survived by her husband Steven, children, and her grandchildren CJ, Delise, Jonah, and Hanna, and by her brother, Allen Fishkin.
