He chose this degree field because he was intelligent and an exceptional writer.

Malcolm's early years were very happy when spending time with his Grandparents, Robert and Elmina Erdmann of Mobile, Alabama. Every weekend was an adventure with swimming, boating, and fishing in Mobile Bay with his grandparents and younger brother Ken.

They would also go to Dixie Burger, visit relatives, exploring the different aspects of living on the bay.

Malcolm was active in many civic organizations, attending conventions, meetings to union activities and politics in general. He loved anything to do with space and a die hard fan of the original Star Trek.

Malcolm married Mark Graham Noble October 27, 2017, after a lengthy courtship. They both lived in a comfortable home in Austin Texas, where they enjoyed raising their 2 dogs, Emerson and Wendy. After Mark passed away October 11, 2018, of Pancreatic Cancer, his friends helped him navigate through his sightless life. His friends were unwavering and meant the world to him including his most loyal friend Mike Ragusa of Pflugerville, Texas. Mike was extremely helpful by making sure Malcolm's bills were paid, groceries were purchased and helping him with his medical and emotional support.

Malcolm was a good and unique soul. He is survived by his brother Ken Graham (Sandra), niece Kendra Hudgins (Kyle), nephew Derek Graham and his beloved dog Wendy.
