Known for her strength of character, Michelle always had the courage to forge her own path and stand up for what she believed was right. Raised in the Catholic Church, she embarked on a deeply personal spiritual journey later in life. In 2011, following in her son Jeremy's footsteps, she converted to Judaism. 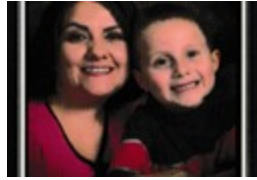
