



Pamela Faye Bradley

November 30, 1946 - November 3, 2022

Pamela Faye Bradley, beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and friend, passed away peacefully at home on November 3, 2022, after a short battle with cancer.

Pam was born in Waynesboro, Pennsylvania on November 30, 1946, to Betty and Robert W. Florence. She was a popular student at Waynesboro High School and was involved in many activities such as gymnastics, glee club and cheerleading. After graduating from high school in 1964, for two years she attended Shepherd College in Shepherdstown, West Virginia, studying elementary education.

Changing career paths, Pam moved to northern Virginia and worked at Lord and Taylor department store, where, as fate would have it, she met Nick, the man who would become her husband. Pam worked in women's sportswear, and Nick in the shoe department. For Nick, it was pretty much settled on their first date. They were married in Waynesboro, Pennsylvania on August 10, 1968. Nick joined the Army a year later and thus began Pam's thirty-year journey as an Army officer's wife. While Nick was in Vietnam, daughter Dana was born. Following Dana's birth and Nick's return from Vietnam, assignments included bases in Kansas, Texas, Alabama, Virginia, and twice in West Germany.

It was in Germany where Pam started her career in physical fitness teaching an aerobics class of her own design. Following a move to Belton, Texas, she became a certified Jazzercise instructor. She taught to capacity crowds in Killeen, Texas for eight years. When Nick was assigned to Fort Belvoir, Virginia, she continued to teach in northern Virginia for three more years. After a 2002 move to Austin, Texas to be closer to family, though retired from instructing, Pam continued to promote Jazzercise and attend classes multiple times a week for the rest of her life.

After their move to Austin, throughout the next twenty years, Pam and Nick traveled to Spain, Scotland, Hong Kong, and Vietnam. Hiking was a favorite pastime so there were summer trips to the Rocky Mountains of the western United States and Canada. Jackson Hole, Wyoming was a favorite getaway.

Pam was preceded in death by her father, Robert W. Florence, and her brother-in-law Joe Bradley. She is survived by her mother, Betty, her loving husband Jack (Nick) Bradley, Jr., sister Janette Koons (husband Denny), sisters-in-law Tish Bradley and Janice Garrett (husband Bob), and her beloved daughter Dana Kunik (husband Daryl) and her two absolute favorite joys, grandchildren Maddox and Reese.

Service will be graveside at Oakwood Cemetery in Austin, Texas on November 30, 2022, at three o'clock PM, followed by a celebration of life at the home of Dana and Daryl Kunik.
