We were honored to go to “Festival”, her favorite shopping spot. I didn’t realize that the week we spent with them would be the last time I saw her.

I’m so happy that Randy and Don were able to move to Austin and spend so much quality time with Dana, David, Janna, and of course, Noah. Every time I spoke to her in the past year, Noah was a main topic and I always got one or two pictures or videos of him soon after our conversation. Randy always asked about how I was doing even when she was feeling the worst. She was so caring and compassionate. I love her very much and will miss her. I will keep her in my heart forever!

I remember a story that my Mother told me when Randy’s mother, Dorothy, was sick. The Aunts were sitting around talking and

decided that when we went to heaven, we met up with all our relatives that had gone before us for a big party. The big question of that day was, "What are we going to wear?" Well Randy, I know you'll enjoy the party.

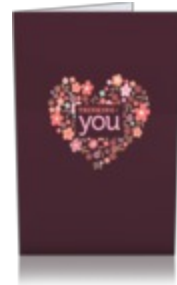

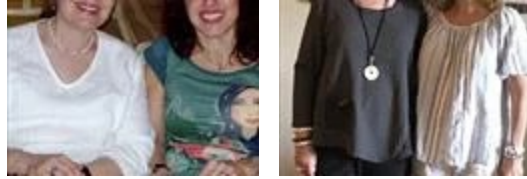
