



Stacy Lynn Corluccio

May 2, 1969 - November 24, 2025

Stacy Lynn Corluccio Powers, beloved wife of Dan Powers, passed into the Light on November 24, 2025, in Austin, Texas, surrounded by loved ones. Stacy did not allow the pancreatic cancer that ultimately took her life to conquer or define her. Her strength, positivity, and resolve were inspiring to everyone she encountered.

Born May 2, 1969, in Buffalo, New York, to Nina Louise and Charles David Corluccio, Stacy became a Texan in 1978. After graduation from Cy-Fair High School 1987, she became a proud Texas Aggie and received her Bachelor of Arts degree in 1992. After graduation, she began a career in risk management with roles in the Texas Workers Compensation Insurance Fund, the Texas Association of School Boards, the National Compensation Institute, and the Texas Association of Counties.

Stacy loved life. Most of all, she loved Dan. They traveled widely, often attending concerts by their favorite groups in different parts of the country. Singing gave her energy and joy, and she and Dan met singing Karaoke. She was a foodie with a special love for desserts and an accomplished cook, and they often entertained a wide circle of friends. An avid gardener, she filled the yard with herbs, vegetables, lemon trees, roses, and flowers which attracted a wide variety of birds and butterflies that she recorded in gallery-worthy photographs. Stacy loved her dogs. The latest member of her canine family, Murphy, brought great joy and comfort in her final year of life. Stacy was 56 years young.

Preceded in death by her stepfather Charles Jagou, Stacy is survived by her husband, Daniel Powers of Austin, Texas, her mother Nina Jagou of Conroe, Texas, her sister Gina Marie Johnson and her husband Clint of Conroe, Texas, her niece Molly Lynn Wilck also of Conroe, her nephews Andrew and Gregory Wilck of Houston, her stepson Evan Powers of Austin, and her father Charles Corluccio of Hamburg, New York, She is also survived by her best friend since age 15, Shaundra Hardt of Brock Texas.
