Susan (Sue) Bonn Fredine, 82, passed away peacefully on May 3, 2025, in Austin, Texas, surrounded by family.

Born in Washington, D.C., Sue dedicated her life to education and service. She worked as a college math instructor and later as a college administrator, inspiring students and colleagues alike with her intelligence, warmth, and commitment to learning.

Sue had a wide range of passions outside of her professional life. She was an avid gardener, a talented pianist, and a recreational racquetball player. She loved reading, long walks, crossword puzzles, and word games, always ready with a quick wit or a well-placed pun. In retirement she did volunteer work with several organizations including Mobile Loaves and Fishes, Drive a Senior, and the Women's Storybook Project. She made great friends in the Northwest Neighbors Social Club, and was active with Temple Beth Shalom. A genuine and social person, Sue was known for her directness, her compassion, her open-mindedness, and her ability to make others feel welcomed and valued.

Sue met John (Jack) Fredine when they were both in college at George Washington University. After she returned from teaching in Africa, Jack proposed and they were married. They had two sons, Dan and Chris, and lived in Bardstown, Kentucky; Atlanta, Georgia; and Lexington, North

Carolina, before moving to the New Orleans area where they lived for several decades. After Hurricane Katrina, they moved to Austin in 2006. Jack passed away in Austin in 2016.

Sue is survived by her son Dan Fredine, daughter-in-law Lisa Appleby Fredine, and granddaughter Alexis Fredine of Austin, TX; her son Chris Fredine, daughter-in-law Nicole Guzzardi Fredine, and grandson Myles John Fredine of Harahan, LA; her sister Laura Halper of Plano, TX; and her brother Jerry Bonn of Stow, MA.

A funeral service will be held at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, May 7 at Austin Memorial Park Cemetery.
