DR. WILLIAM TALLY passed away from the effects of Parkinson's disease Sunday, July 5, 2020, in Victoria, Texas. William was born January 29, 1944, in Henderson, Louisiana to Bennet Tally and Ella May Arnaud Tally. He was preceded in death by his parents.

Dr. Tally graduated from Cecilia High School, attended Tulane University and graduated with a BA in Mathematics from University of Southwest Louisiana in 1968. He earned an MA in Mathematics from University of Michigan and a PhD in Mathematics from Rice University in Houston, TX. William returned to Henderson, Louisiana in the 1980s and was a craftsman and the owner of Swamp Things in Henderson for many years. Dr. Tally also served as a professor and math teacher at colleges and high schools in the area. In 2018, he moved to Victoria, Texas to be near his son and family.

William is survived by his son, William "Bill" Bennett Tally (Brenda Serrata) of Victoria, and his grandson, William "Billy" Robert Tally; his siblings, Elizabeth Tally Dupre (James Joseph "J.J."), Irma Tally Huval, and Jack Tally; and many nieces and nephews in the Lafayette area.
